





***Partner In Service Award*** - The Partners in Service Award is given to each Key Club, which, through its unselfish service efforts, has participated in at least one project with each official partner during an administrative year. **The four official partners of Key Club International are UNICEF, Children's Miracle Network, March of Dimes, and Read and Lead. Examples - Some Key Clubs have assisted in coaching athletes for Special Olympics.**

***The R. A. (Bob) Cageorge Achievement Contest*** - each Key club is required to enter a report of its activities for the school year, using the standard form from Annual Key Club Achievement Report for the current Key Club year. The report must be typed, complete all information in the spaces provided. The top three reports in each section (platinum, gold, silver and bronze) will be awarded prizes. Reports containing duplicate activities will be disqualified. For the District Convention, all clubs shall be required to submit the Annual Achievement Report, to the Key Club District Administrator, prior to being permitted to register at Convention.

***The Governor's/ District Service Project Award (GSP)*** -When your club participates in the Governor's/ District Service Project, and you complete a detailed report of your project(s), your club will be eligible for this award. The Project this year once again is Sleeping Children around the World.

***Travel Award*** - The Travel award is given to the club who brings the most Key Clubbers (Advisors not included) to a Convention, multiplied by the number of kilometers traveled. Since Conventions are held all over Eastern Canada it is possible for ANY club to win!

***The A. J. (Tony) Pelosse Single Service Award*** - This Award is given to the Key Club in recognition of their best single project defined as a project, planned, organized and produced during the year dedicated to the betterment of others rather than self, through unselfish efforts. The award is given in memory of A.J. (Tony) Pelosse, who was District Administrator from 1977 until his death in 1991. Each Key Club is urged to enter its most outstanding single service activity. Some previous entries included a Skip-a-thon and helping street youth. So find a worthy cause and have fun!

***Distinguished Awards for Club Presidents and Secretaries*** - If you have an amazing President or your club Secretary has gone the extra mile for the club you may wish to consider nominating them for these awards. The awards are given to the individuals who have met the required criteria that make them distinguished leaders in our District.

***The Kenneth S. Wynkie District Administrator Award*** - Do you think you have an extra special, hardworking member in your Key Club? Nominate that person for this honour and along with the award, the lucky recipient will receive a cash award from the Kiwanis Club of Ottawa in memory of Kenneth S. Wynkie who served as a Key Club District Administrator from 1967 until 1974. Note: District Board Members are not eligible for this award.

***Allen Stewart Most Outstanding Faculty Advisor and the Brian W. McGarry Most Outstanding Kiwanis Advisor Award*** - Has your Faculty or Kiwanis Advisor done a spectacular job throughout the year and you wish to recognize them. This may be the perfect way to show your appreciation! The award for most outstanding Faculty Advisor has been donated by Mr. Allen Stewart, Past Governor of Eastern Canada and the Caribbean District of Kiwanis International. The award for most outstanding Kiwanis Advisor has been named in honour of Mr. Brian W. McGarry who served as Key Club District Administrator from 1974 - 1977. Here is your opportunity to recognize your Advisors for their outstanding contributions to you and your Club, by simply filling out the required information.

All contest entries, ***except for the "Matching Scholarship"*** are to be brought to the Convention. I hope your club will enter as many contests as possible. —
